August 11, 2010 Conference Call on SEC's Rule 12b-1 Proposal

SEC'S RULE 12B-1 PROPOSAL

As you know, we are in the process of developing the Institute's positions on the proposal by the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) to replace rule 12b-1 with a new distribution framework for fund shares. [1] Toward this end, we will hold a conference call with all interested ICI members on August 10th to discuss the substance of the proposal and get members' initial reactions.

We will have another conference call at 4:00 p.m. (Eastern) on Wednesday, August 11th with members of the Small Funds Committee to explore the potential impacts of the proposal on smaller fund complexes. This call will be one of a series of calls we are having with particular sets of committees in an effort to discuss certain aspects of the proposal in greater detail.
