During the final portion of the meeting the Institute will be asking the committee to vote on the proposal that we have discussed previously to standardize nomenclature for multiple classes of shares. A copy of the proposal is attached. At that time we will also be asking for your suggestions on an important new Institute initiative for enhanced education and disclosure to bank customers. Check your meeting packet for background information. You have received a separate mailing describing other meetings, general sessions and social events to be held the week of January 12 - 14.
